



P On the day of her baptism, Anne Boswell was clothed in Christ. In the day of Christ's coming she will be clothed with glory.





Anne Boswell



Anne Boswell of Hudson Ohio passed away on July 2, 2021 at the age of 61 while in Hospice care after a hard-fought battle with a rare and aggressive form of cancer, Angiosarcoma. Anne is survived by her husband Dennis and daughter Amanda, mother Joyce Ostrowske, brother Lew Smith, sister-in-law Marge (David) Johnson, sister-in-law Patti Davies, and brother-in-law Michael (Kimberly) Boswell. Additionally, she leaves behind cherished aunts, uncles, cousins, nieces, nephews, colleagues, and friends. She is predeceased by her father Donald Smith and several beloved family members and friends.

Anne was born August 27, 1959, in Ravenna Ohio and grew up in Mantua Ohio. While attending Crestwood High School, she was selected as the Mantua Potato Festival Queen, won the state championship baton twirling competition, and met her husband, Dennis. They were married on May 13, 1978. Following the birth of their daughter Amanda, Anne began working as a paraprofessional (teaching aide) in the Hudson City School District. During this time and while working with several wonderful educators, Anne realized her gift and passion for teaching. This realization led her to the University of Akron at age 48 to begin her bachelor's degree in education where she graduated Summa Cum Laude in 2012. Upon completing her student teaching, she taught in Twinsburg, Cuyahoga Falls, and most recently in Cuyahoga Heights. She also completed her master's degree and obtained her endorsement for gifted education, as she spent most of her years teaching gifted children in the classroom.

Anne also energetically coached high school volleyball for 12 years in Hudson, Twinsburg, and Cuyahoga Falls, as well as several local JO teams. She coached many athletes and shared her love of the sport with them. In addition to her love of teaching and coaching, Anne enjoyed gardening, traveling, live music, keeping her cars in pristine condition, and sitting on her porch or deck with a cup of coffee and a good book.

Family and friends are invited to gather anytime between 11:00 AM to 11:45AM and the service will begin at noon.
